Jaimee will go on to represent Gymea North Public School at Sydney East Regional level on Tuesday 17 March. We omitted to announce a fourth record broken by Jaime at the school carnival. Jaime set a new record for the girls' 11 years freestyle in a time of 33.78. Congratulations.

There will be an organised **Special Assembly** held on Wednesday, 25 March (Week 9) from 10.45am in the hall to farewell our retiring principal, **Ms Sandra Forman**. At National Young Leaders' Day, I had a 'really fun time'. I liked Bianca Chatfield because she overcame adversity. She also never liked being tall but she found a use for it in netball. She didn't like national netball at first because she was 18 and the youngest in the team. In her school years, it was an enjoyable sport but when she started playing for Australia everyone was older and she felt lost, that all they cared about was winning, but she stuck at it and it made her realise how younger members of the team now need her. So overall Bianca Chatfield was an inspiration to us all.

I liked Erin Molan because she said many nice things. I especially liked it when she told us to 'never give up'. It was really inspirational as she told us she had received 98 messages telling her she was not good enough but she kept going and never gave up herself.

An inspiration to the world, John Coutis has overcome bullying and the challenging aspect of having a disability. Being born premature, the doctors said he wouldn't make it through the night but living his best life as an amputee and inspirational speaker, he strives to keep kids chasing their dreams. Listening to John Coutis' speech made me feel strength to strive for my own goals to do what I want to in life.

The P&C have been working hard to organise a **Colour Run fundraiser,** which will be held in week 10 on April 2nd after lunch. It promises to be a fun afternoon, filled with white t-shirts, coloured bombs and loads of laughter. 2021 High School 'Expression of Interest' Forms for government schools will be sent home this week on Wednesday 11 March. The high school your child should attend based on local enrolment areas will be written on the form. Your permanent residential address determines which school is your local school. Parents will have the opportunity to apply for non-local high school places and will need to provide reasons why you would like your child to attend the school/s based on their selection criteria. These expressions of interest are then considered by a placement panel. Please read "Moving into Year 7 in a NSW Government School in 2021" for further information as Expression of Interest forms must be returned **on or before Friday 20 March 2020.**

NAPLAN Online **practice tests** will be completed by Year 3 and 5 students next week. These practice tests are carried out to determine the school's network capabilities and to pre-empt any technology issues before the actual tests take place in Term 2.

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

The Gymea North Public School **ANZAC Ceremony** will be held on Thursday 9 April (Week 11). We ask that students wear a sprig of rosemary on the day. Our **Easter Parade and raffle** will be 2.30pm onwards that same day. More information will follow in coming weeks.
